WE LIVE IN A TROUBLED WORLD

King David was aware of the world he lived in. The world we live in is not far different. It is a world where evil and iniquity seek to reign.

"⁴ For You are not a God who takes pleasure in wickedness, Nor shall evil dwell with You.

⁵The boastful shall not stand in Your sight; You hate all workers of iniquity.

⁶You shall destroy those who speak falsehood; The Lord abhors the bloodthirsty and deceitful man.

⁷ But as for me, I will come into Your house in the multitude of Your mercy; In fear of You I will worship toward Your holy temple.

⁸Lead me, O Lord, in Your righteousness because of my enemies;
Make Your way straight before my face."

Psalm 5:4-8

19 Consider my enemies, for they are many; And they hate me with cruel hatred.

²⁰ Keep my soul, and deliver me; Let me not be ashamed, for I put my trust in You.

²¹ Let integrity and uprightness preserve me, For I wait for You.

22 Redeem Israel, O God, Out of all their troubles!

 - b. Exercising trust in God
 - c. Practising faith in waiting upon God with integrity and uprightness

SUNDAY PULPIT NOTES

12 OCTOBER 2025

Theme: "Men always ought to pray" Luke 18:1

Text: Acts 1 – 2

Title: "Continued with one accord in prayer and supplication"

INTRODUCTION

- 1. We have learnt many rich principles of prayer from the example of the Lord Jesus!
- 2. The challenge is to practice prayer personally and as a Church!
- 3. The Book of Acts
 - a. The Gospels record how the Apostles struggled but pressed on!
 - b. The Book of Acts records how they succeeded!
 - i. They were filled with the Spirit of God
 - ii. They continued fervently in prayer!
 - iii. The power of God worked mightily in their life and ministry!

THE PRACTICE OF PRAYER AMONG THE APOSTLES

¹² Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day's journey. ¹³ And when they had entered, they went up into the upper room where they were staying: Peter, James, John, and Andrew; Philip and Thomas; Bartholomew and Matthew; James the son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot; and Judas the son of James. ¹⁴ These all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication, with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with His brothers.

Acts 1:12 – 14

- 1. They were chosen by the Lord Jesus Christ to be His Apostles
 - a. They were called and chosen to bear witness of Christ
 - b. They were carefully taught by the Lord Jesus
 - c. They were told to wait for the Promise of the Father to come upon them!

- 2. They gathered in the upper room
 - a. They stayed together
 - b. They prayed together
- 3. They continued with one accord in prayer and supplication
 - a. What it means to "Continue" in prayer
 - i. To pray with much effort!
 - ii. To pray faithfully
 - iii. To pray diligently
 - iv. To continue steadfastly in prayer
 - b. What it means to be in "One accord" in prayer
 - i. A common focus to pray!
 - ii. A united purpose to pray!

THE CHOOSING OF MATTHIAS

¹⁵ And in those days Peter stood up in the midst of the disciples (altogether the number of names was about a hundred and twenty), and said, ¹⁶ "Men and brethren, this Scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit spoke before by the mouth of David concerning Judas, who became a guide to those who arrested Jesus; ¹⁷ for he was numbered with us and obtained a part in this ministry."

¹⁸ (Now this man purchased a field with the wages of iniquity; and falling headlong, he burst open in the middle and all his entrails gushed out. ¹⁹ And it became known to all those dwelling in Jerusalem; so that field is called in their own language, Akel Dama, that is, Field of Blood.)

²⁰ "For it is written in the Book of Psalms: 'Let his dwelling place be [i]desolate, And let no one live in it'; and, 'Let another take his office.'

²¹ "Therefore, of these men who have accompanied us all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, ²² beginning from the baptism of John to that day when He was taken up from us, one of these must become a witness with us of His resurrection."

- ²³ And they proposed two: Joseph called Barsabas, who was surnamed Justus, and Matthias. ²⁴ And they prayed and said, "You, O Lord, who know the hearts of all, show which of these two You have chosen ²⁵ to take part in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas by transgression fell, that he might go to his own place." ²⁶ And they cast their lots, and the lot fell on Matthias. And he was numbered with the eleven apostles. Acts 1:15-26
 - 1. The Apostle Peter proposed that another should be chosen to replace Judas in the ministry of the Apostles
 - 2. There were about 120 disciples who made up the Church in Jerusalem
 - 3. They were united in their decision to choose Matthias
 - 4. The process of making this decision
 - a. Guided by the Word of God
 - b. The candidate must be a witness with them of the risen Christ
 - c. The final decision was made in prayer

THE PRACTICE OF PRAYER AMONG THE MEMBERS OF THE CHURCH

⁴⁰ And with many other words he testified and exhorted them, saying, "Be saved from this perverse generation." ⁴¹ Then those who gladly received his word were baptized; and that day about three thousand souls were added to them. ⁴² And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers. ⁴³ Then fear came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were done through the apostles. ⁴⁴ Now all who believed were together, and had all things in common, ⁴⁵ and sold their possessions and goods, and divided them among all, as anyone had need.

⁴⁶So continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart, ⁴⁷ praising God and having favour with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved.

Acts 1:40 – 47

- 1. How new members were added to the Church
 - a. Through the faithful preaching and teachings of the Apostles

- b. Those who received the gospel message with gladness of heart
- c. They were baptised and became new members of the Church
- 2. How they **continued** in their faith
 - a. They **continued** steadfastly
 - i. In the apostle's doctrine (Teachings of Christ)
 - ii. In breaking of bread (Communion)
 - iii. In prayer
 - b. They had all things in common
 - i. Oneness of heart and mind
 - ii. They cared for each other practically
 - c. They continued daily with one accord
 - i. In worship"In the temple..."
 - ii. In fellowship "In breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart"
- 3. The presence of God in the Church
 - a. Praising God
 - b. Having favour with all people
 - c. The Lord added daily to the Church those who were being saved
